- ◉ From the Greek *biblia* (books)
- ◉ Multiple authors written over hundreds of years
- ◉ Originally Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek
- ◉ Highest source of authority and wisdom for majority of Christians
- ◉ One of the world's most widely read books

5. Harry Potter series, JK Rowling – 450m

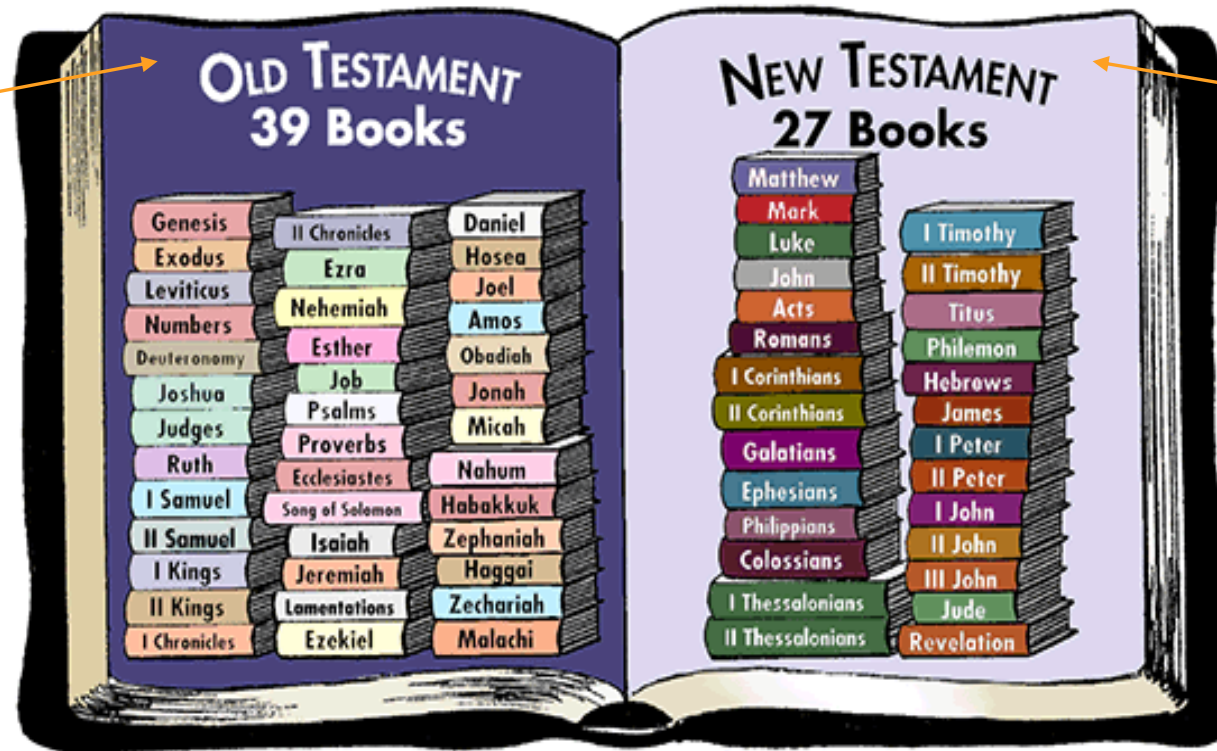

But...

- Different Christians have different versions of the Bible:

Protestants = **66** books

Catholics = **73** books

Orthodox = **79** books



Interpretations differ too:

Literal/Fundamentalist – Bible is God's word & 100% true

Conservative – Bible written by humans inspired by God

Liberal – Bible written by humans trying to understand God



LITERAL/FUNDAMENTALIST

God created the world as it says in the book of *Genesis*. Science is wrong; there was no Big Bang or evolution. Scientific evidence is a test of faith from God.



LIBERAL

Science is true and in fact goes on to prove that God exists. Only God could have caused the Big Bang and the conditions necessary for life to develop as it has.

CONSERVATIVE

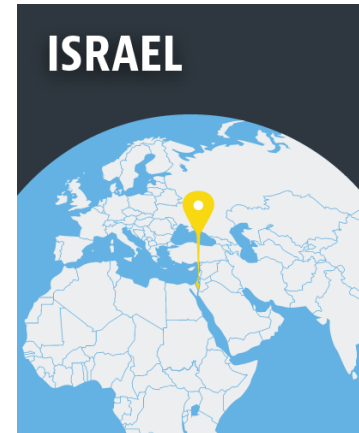
Both the Bible and science are accurate. You cannot accept the Bible as literally true, so the world was not created in 6 days, but was created in order as set out in *Genesis*.

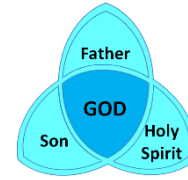

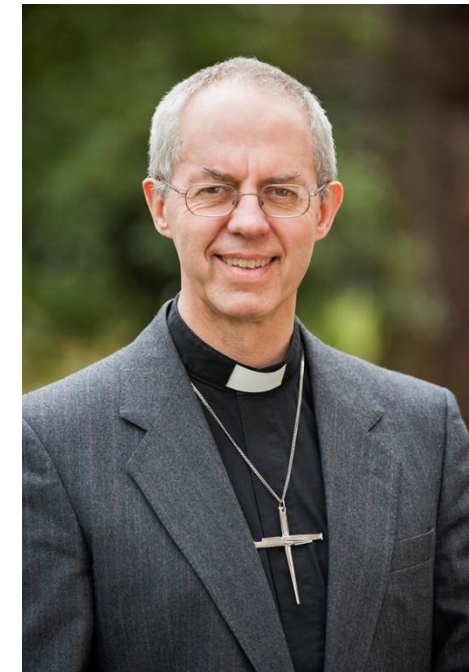

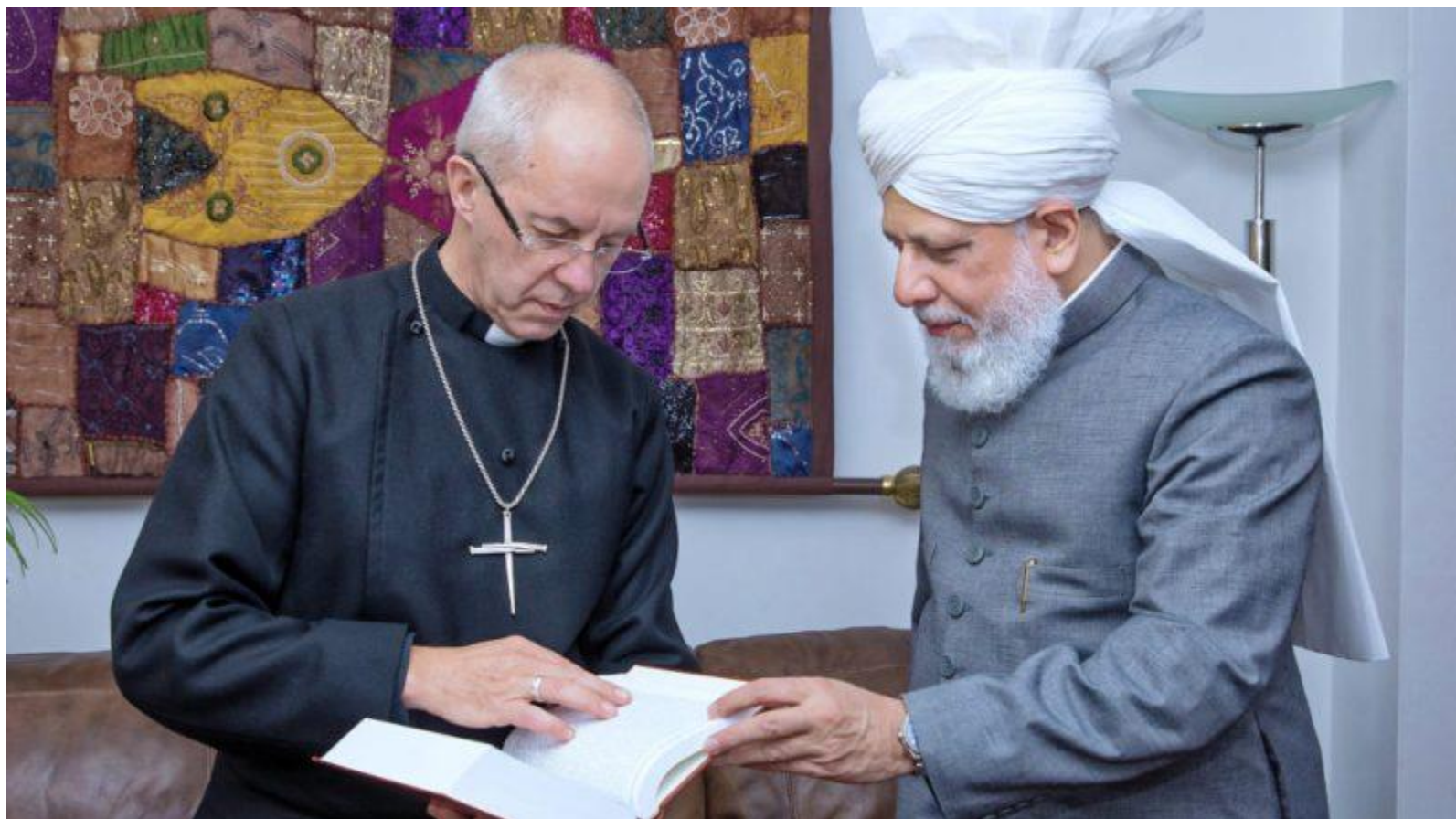

Christian Church Family Tree

At first the Christian Church had identical beliefs.

In 312 the Emperor Constantine became a Christian and so Rome helped the spread of Christianity.

1000 years later a split happened between East and West. This split involved different ideas.



In 1517 a priest called Martin Luther objected to how the Catholic Church ran the religion. He listed 95 objections he had.

In 1534, Henry VIII broke away from the Pope and became the Head of his own Church The Church of England.

Since then different groups (denominations) felt the need to worship God in different ways.

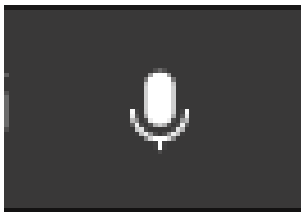
